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Grade 1: Weekly Phonics Focus
Lesson 8

In our classroom this week, we are learning to read and spell closed syllable words with initial or final s-blends. Here are the letters and patterns to practice this week:

| Consonants | $b, c, d, f, g, h, j, k, l, m, n, p, q, r, s, t, v, w, x, z$ <br> $y$ at the beginning of $a$ word |
| :--- | :--- |
| Vowels | $a, e, i, o, u$ <br> $y$ at the end of a word |
| Initial and Final <br> s-blends | An s-blend has 2 consonants side by side and the first one <br> is the letter $s$. Each consonant in a blend is pronounced. <br> Initial blends are found at the beginning of a word. <br> Final blends are found at the end of a word. |
| Closed Syllables | Closed syllable words have 1 vowel letter followed by 1 or <br> more consonants, and the vowel sound is short. |

Here are some examples of closed syllable words with initial or final s-blends:

| Initial <br> s-blends <br> $(s k-, s l-, s m-, s n-, s p-, s t-, s w-)$ | Final <br> s-blends <br> $(-s k,-s t,-s p)$ |
| :---: | :---: |
| scab | dust |
| skid | fast |
| snag | gasp |
| spot | risk |
| stub | task |
