## Grade 1: Weekly Phonics Focus Lesson 8

In our classroom this week, we are learning to read and spell **closed syllable** words with **initial or final s-blends**. Here are the letters and patterns to practice this week:

Consonants	b, c, d, f, g, h, j, k, l, m, n, p, q, r, s, t, v, w, x, z y at the beginning of a word
Vowels	a, e, i, o, u y at the end of a word
Initial and Final s-blends	An s-blend has 2 consonants side by side and the first one is the letter s. Each consonant in a blend is pronounced.  Initial blends are found at the beginning of a word.  Final blends are found at the end of a word.
Closed Syllables	Closed syllable words have 1 vowel letter followed by 1 or more consonants, and the vowel sound is short.

Here are some examples of closed syllable words with initial or final s-blends:

Initial s-blends (sk-, sl-, sm-, sn-, sp-, st-, sw-)	Final s-blends (-sk, -st, -sp)
<u>sc</u> ab	du <u>st</u>
<u>sk</u> id	fa <u>st</u>
<u>sn</u> ag	ga <u>sp</u>
<u>sp</u> ot	ri <u>sk</u>
<u>st</u> ub	ta <u>sk</u>
