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## Grade 1: Weekly Phonics Focus Lesson 9

In our classroom this week, we are learning to read and spell **closed syllable** words with **initial and final I- or t-blends**. Here are the letters and patterns to practice this week:

Consonants	b, c, d, f, g, h, j, k, l, m, n, p, q, r, s, t, v, w, x, z y at the beginning of a word	
Vowels	a, e, i, o, u y at the end of a word	
Initial and Final I- and t-blends	An I- or t-blend has 2 consonants side by side. Each consonant in a blend is pronounced.	
Closed Syllables	Closed syllable words have 1 vowel letter followed by 1 or more consonants, and the vowel sound is short.	

Here are some examples of closed syllable words with initial and final I- or t-blends:

Initial I-blends (bl-, cl-, fl-, gl-, pl-, sl-)	Final I-blends (-ld, -lf, -lk, -lt, -lp)	Initial t-blends (st-, tr-, tw-)	<b>Final t-blends</b> (-ct, -ft, -lt, -nt, -pt, -st)
<u>bl</u> ast	fe <u>lt</u>	<u>st</u> ep	be <u>st</u>
<u>cl</u> ip	gu <u>lp</u>	<u>st</u> op	hu <u>nt</u>
<u>fl</u> ag	he <u>ld</u>	<u>tr</u> ap	li <u>ft</u>
<u>pl</u> um	se <u>lf</u>	<u>tw</u> in	ke <u>pt</u>

*Note:* Some example words in the table above may include more than 1 of the focus patterns.
